## **Intimate Care and Toileting Policy**

It is essential that parent/s alert the school – in writing and in a timely manner – to specific toileting/intimate care needs that may need to be considered.

## **Children with Specific Toileting/Intimate Care Needs:**

- In all situations where a pupil needs assistance with toileting/intimate care, a meeting will be convened - after a place in the school has been accepted and confirmed and before the child starts school.
- In all situations where a pupil needs assistance with specific newly-emerging toileting/intimate care
  needs, a meeting will be convened, prior to the school addressing those needs.
- Parents/Guardians, Principal, Class Teacher (as appropriate/practicable), (SNA as may be relevant)
  will attend the meeting, and if appropriate, the pupil, will attend.
- The specific care needs of the child, and how the school will seek to address them, will be clarified.
- Personnel involved in this care will be identified.
- Provision for occasions when members of staff are absent will be outlined (e.g. Substitute SNA staff
  will not generally be involved in intimate care although there may be cases when this is
  warranted/appropriate). Any change of personnel will be discussed with the pupil, if appropriate.
- Two members of staff will be present when dealing with intimate care needs.
- Any changes will be discussed with parent/guardian (and pupil, if appropriate) and noted in writing to the pupil's file.
- As far as possible, the pupil will be involved in identification of his/her personal requirements, wishes, changes etc.
- A written copy of the agreement will be kept on the pupil's file.
- Parents will be notified of any changes from agreed procedures e.g. in response to exceptional circumstances.
- At all times the dignity and privacy of the pupil will be paramount in addressing intimate care needs.
- Staff are advised of the importance of wearing protective gloves.

## **Toileting Accidents:**

- The attention of parents/guardians of incoming pupils will be directed to school policies on our website
- <u>www.sstreasa.ie</u> or in hard copy, as appropriate. Parents are asked to submit in writing to the school
   - for consideration any specific wishes regarding toileting accidents. It is the responsibility of the
   parents/guardians to ensure that such wishes are submitted to the school in writing, at the beginning
   of subsequent school year/s as appropriate.
- A general supply of clean underwear, wipes, track-suit bottoms etc. will be kept in the school.
- In the first instance, the pupil will be offered fresh clothing to clean and change themselves.

- If, for any reason, the child is unable to clean or change themselves, the procedure agreed with parents/guardians (where relevant) will be followed in so far as is possible, bearing in mind the possibility of exceptional circumstances.
- If staff must clean/change the child, two members of staff familiar to the child, if possible will attend to him/her.
- Staff are advised of the importance of wearing protective gloves.
- Parents will be notified of these accidents.
- A record of the incident should be kept.
